- **Amo / praefero** + *accusativus* => vestis **quam** amo est colore... / vestes ..... amo...

- **Mihi placet / placent** + *nominativus* => vestis **quae** mihi placet est... / vestes .....  
mihi placent sunt...

- Vestes ..... **me induere** (+ *ablativus*) **soleo** sunt colore...
